Cleaning Methods

For Grease and Oil Stains:
Use *Commercial Degreasers*

For Rust Stains from Metal Furniture:
Use *Phosphoric Acid Cleaners*

For Normal Dirt and Grime: Use *Deck Washes*

For Mold and Mildew Stains: Use *Bleach and Deck Washes*

For Stubborn Grease or Oil Stains: Use *Spot Removers/Thinners*
Use sparingly-wash off quickly with water, as they can affect the embossed grain pattern.

For Ground-in Dirt and Mold or Mildew Stains: Use *Pressure Washers*

Some tips for keeping
your WeatherBest Deck
looking its best.

*Your WeatherBest composite deck was
designed to withstand the elements and to be
very low maintenance.*

By following a few common-sense rules, you can keep
your WeatherBest deck looking beautiful and clean.

Periodically wash down your deck and railing with a hose
even if it looks clean. This prevents the buildup of pollen and
other airborne pollutants that promote mold and mildew growth.

Deal with stains quickly. Don't allow them to penetrate
the deck's surface or bake on in the direct sun.

Grease will stain any surface.
Keep a splatter guard under your barbecue grill.

Make sure your deck boards are sufficiently gapped or spaced.
This will help prevent water from pooling on the surface of your deck
and staining it. Using a flat tool, when necessary, you should clean out
the expansion gaps between the boards to ensure proper drainage.

Note: *You may experience a color shift in the first 120 days as your
decking gets acclimated. The deck color may lighten slightly over time.*
